Pep & Marching Band

The majority of this year's pep band performances will be handled by the Wildcat Show Band, a volunteer group. For more information, click here.

Concert Band, Wind Ensemble, and Jazz Band classes will perform at the Veterans Day Parade on November 11th. This is a graded event.

Dress code for Marching Band is a black shirt, black socks, black shoes, and PE pants (any color) all worn under the school marching band uniform that will be checked out to you.

Outdoor/marching Instruments are the instruments we play for parades, school assemblies, and sports games.

- Some students use a 2nd, less expensive instrument for outdoor playing. This is recommended, but not always an option.
- Some students use the same instruments outside that they do for concerts. This is not recommended, but sometimes our only option.
- Some students change to a different section for outdoor playing.
- The school provides outdoor instruments for French Horn, Baritone, Tuba, double reed and percussion students.

Band Lockers

Band students may check out a locker for their band instrument(s). They must use a school padlock. We will check out lockers during class and both 1st & 2nd lunch.

Dress Code for Concerts

Concert Band & Symphonic Band

All-black: shirt, shoes, pants/skirts. Socks should be black with shoes or skin-tone with heels/flats. No logos, dots, or stripes. ROTC shoes are ok. Formal preferred but not required, just all-black.

Symphonic Band will be issued a black vest from the school to go over their formals.

Wind Ensemble & Jazz Band

Tux style: black dress OR pants/skirt + jacket/blazer. Black socks and dress shoes (marching and ROTC shoes ok). White shirt/blouse. Bow tie required for collared shirts.

Other music gear details:

- Plastic reeds are the best choice for high school band students, and in stock at our local music store. You only need wooden reeds if you are auditioning for all-state, pro music jobs, or music scholarships.
- Brass instruments need to be cleaned and oiled BEFORE class.
- Drummers: Wooden drumsticks are required.
- Strings: please have your own tuner or tuner-app, and be ready to quietly re-tune while I am teaching.
- Electrics: Please bring your own guitar & audio cable, but the rest is optional.
