



What is Color Guard/Winter Guard?

Color Guard is a performance art that uses dancing and acting while spinning and tossing flags, rifles and other equipment to give a visual interpretation of music. The Color Guard performs alongside the Wildcat Show Band (marching band) in the fall season at football game half times, parades and marching band competitions.

How hard is Color Guard?

Color Guard can be physical and mentally demanding. Like any other sport, you will need to build endurance, muscle strength as well as increase your mental sharpness and focus. Don't worry, we don't demand that on the first day. We will teach you these skills starting with basics and progress as we go.

How Auditions Work - Our auditions are not done in a traditional manner

We are willing to offer a team position to any student that shows zeal and commitment to learning all aspects of our program (dancing, acting & spinning) along with committing to our rehearsal and performance schedule. Every team member has a purpose within our shows. When one member is missing because they don't know their part due to lack of participation (due to attendance or other), it throws off the balance and everyone, including the band suffers. Students, you will only be able to learn and progress in skills if you attend all rehearsals.

Who can join the Color Guard?

All students in the Oak Harbor School District, including those that are homeschooled, that will be in grades 9-12 in the fall of 2025 are invited to join.

Experience needed?

No experience needed. We have instructors and current members to help you learn what you need to know.

What does is cost to join?

- · There are no fees for Color Guard or Winter Guard
- You'll need to purchase personal items: performance shoes, guard gloves and a team t-shirt. Approximate cost: \$80+/-

What are the rehearsal/training requirements if I am accepted into Color Guard?

Summer Training (3 weeks in August)

- Color Guard Camp: August 4-8, 8am-3pm at the high school. Includes in depth dance, flag, rifle & other training.
- Band Camp: August 11-15 & 18-22, 8am-3pm at the high school. Additional guard training along with marching and drill training with the band.

When School is in Session (all are required)

- Color Guard rehearsals: Monday, Wednesday & Friday, 6:00-8:00pm. Days/times may change, pending on approval for the season.
- Show Band Rehearsals: Tuesdays & Thursdays, 3:00pm-6:00pm. Days/times may change pending on approval for the season.





I want to give it a try, what do I do next?

Come to our Audition Info Meeting which is held right before we start the first day of audition camp: May 6th at 5:30pm in the band room. Parents/Guardians are suggested to come with their student(s) to meet the instructors, current team members, learn more about the program, how auditions work and ask any questions. If parents/guardians can't make it to the meeting or have additional questions, send the instructor an email at guard@ohhsbandboosters.com

What if I missed the meeting?

No problem! Fill out the Audition Agreement, OHHS Progress Report (which is filled out by your current teachers) & then come to audition camp. The Audition Agreement must be signed by you and your parent/legal guardian. You may also choose to submit the online form on our website. Either way, the agreement must be received by May 11th and the Progress report is due May 13th.

When is Audition Camp & Auditions?

- May 12th -15th: 6:00pm 8:00pm in the OHHS band room (D220)
- May 16th (Audition Day): 6:00pm 8:00pm in the band room (D220)

Wear work out clothing and shoes (no hoodies or jeans). Bring knee pads and a water bottle. If you have long hair, you must tie it up so that you keep it off of your face. We need to see you and you need to see us - no hats or beanies.

You will learn different skills along with a short audition routine. We provide all the equipment needed. It is important that you show up willing, eager, and open to every aspect of the audition process. It is highly likely that we will ask you to do some things that we know you have never done before. We recognize that you will likely be stronger in some areas more than others. And that's okay. Just come ready to learn, give it a try and have fun.

Students decide if they want to officially audition on Audition Day (last day). Everyone will know whether they have been offered a position on the team at the end of the day.

What happens next if I am offered a position on the Color Guard?

- 1. Students have until May 23rd to officially accept their position on the team. As stated in the info packet, we want students to be fully committed to our program and our schedule, so we leave the final decision up to them. Directions and info on how to accept the position will be given on the last day of camp.
- 2. Once you accept your position, the first 2025 Color Guard meeting will take place. This a parent & student meeting that will be held in-person on Tuesday, May 28th at 6:00pm in the band room. This meeting will outline the Fall season. You will meet additional staff along with meeting other members, getting schedules, filling out required paperwork and more. *Most important, measurements for your uniform will be taken.* **This is a REQUIRED meeting.**
